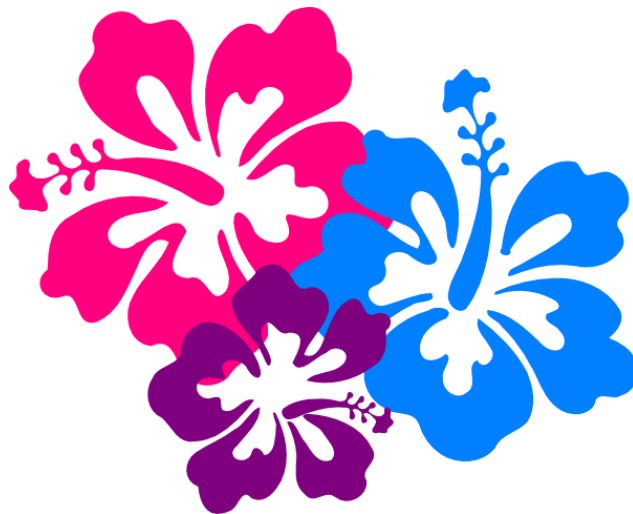

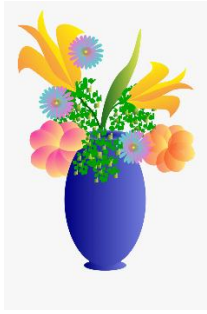


Sunday School, Children and Worship, & Nursery Care

Hudson River Housing Senior Housing:

The Seniors at 134 Cannon Street are low income and are no longer able to afford homes or apartments. We have started providing a meal on the 4th Sunday of each month for the 40 seniors living there.

The meals can be anything you would like to make. During cold weather days, simple soup and sandwiches; chili with bread and butter; Sloppy Joes; Beef Stroganoff casserole. During warmer weather simple franks and beans, sandwiches wraps and salads.

Andrew Graduation

Andrew has mastered theology. Well, that is kind of impossible, but he did complete his courses and graduated from the Master of Theology (ThM) degree at Western Theological Seminary. ***Join us in thanking God for Andrew's growth through the ThM degree.***

Transition back to Colombia

We will be returning to Medellin the first week of July so that the kids can start school, and Andrew can prepare for the first day of classes at the Seminary later in the month. ***We ask that you join us in prayer for a complication-free process for renewing Irene's visa, and we ask for wisdom in organizing the kids' reentry into Colombian school (which is in the middle of its school year).***

Fundraising Goal

Finally, we are excited to share some of the progress in our fundraising campaign. We need to raise \$12,000/year to meet our budget.
