Property Updates



The Property committee has been very busy making preparations for two significant projects that you will see taking place starting this April.

The roof area encompassing the entire sanctuary, and the entire wing from the Gathering area to the main kitchen is in need of new shingles. There are actual signs of leaks in places. After reviewing contractor bids, we selected the company that provided excellent work on portions of the parsonage roof last year. They also had the lower cost estimate. The work is anticipated to start the week after

Easter, weather permitting. The \$126,000 cost of this project will be taken from the property reserve fund.

The other project you will see after the roof work is repairs to the three large stained-glass windows in the sanctuary. As you know these windows consist of several hundred stained-glass panes that were saved from the old church and reinstalled in the current sanctuary as it was built. The thin wood that holds the panes in place has weathered badly, with considerable loose & missing areas of putty, and peeling paint. We have engaged a firm that specializes in maintenance and repair of stained-glass windows to scrape, putty, prime and paint all of the exterior wood. Finally, a clear vinyl sheet will be installed over the windows for weather protection. This project is planned to take place after the roof work is complete, and is priced at \$43,000, also from the property reserve.

Notes from the Pastoral Search Committee

Your search committee has worked diligently in preparing and positioning ourselves to attract the best candidates possible. **We have reached out not only through the Reformed Church denomination but through our partner denominations which include the Presbyterian Church, The UCC, and the Ecumenical Lutherans as well as non-denominational sources. We have also reached out to the major seminaries for them to post on their “job boards” for graduates.**



Up to this point, several resumes and pastoral profiles have been received as well as several letters of inquiry. While early results have not been very promising, we believe there is someone out there whom God will call for us. There are a great many churches looking for either part- or full-time ministers and we have learned that this process will be more like a marathon than a sprint. Please keep the committee in your prayers.

The Workshop meetings for April will be on the 8th, 15th, 22nd and 29th. There will be no meeting on April 1st due to the schools off for Spring Break.

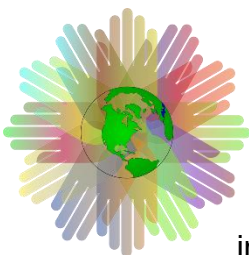

Food Closet: Many thanks to everyone donating food last month. We certainly appreciate it as does the local Food Pantries. **Any kind of non-perishable food will be happily accepted. There are lists at the Information Table for both Liberty Station (Housing of homeless Veterans) and local food pantries. Once a month we deliver to a food pantry. We rotate so all the local pantries are included.** Anything donated exclusively for Liberty Station will indeed be delivered to the Vets.

Senior Meal Volunteers: The new 2026 Volunteer Sign-up sheet is now available on the Info Table in the Gathering Area. **April through August is available and October through December is equally available.** Please feel free to select a date and prepare whatever meal you would like. There are no dietary restrictions so any menu you would like to make is ALWAYS appreciated by these seniors. **Most live exclusively on food stamps (SNAP) which has been tremendously decreased. Irene Moody drafted and mailed a beautiful letter inviting 16 local churches to join in with preparing a nice meal for these wonderful seniors.** They are so appreciative for these meals.



Blood Drive: The American Red Cross will once again be here at New Hackensack to provide a blood drive on **April 7th from 1pm until 6pm.**

Clothing Bin: \$1,147.54 has been received through February.

Ladies Lunch Gathering: The next Ladies Gathering will be April 22nd, 12 noon at Red Line Diner. Please contact Arra Mowry if you would like to attend. All are welcome. If you have any friends, senior neighbors who you feel would like to join us, please invite them and let Arra know.

Rural & Migrant Ministry: RMM continues to offer support to all our migrants who maintain work visas issues by the USA. Food deliveries are made to the families who are no longer able to get to the markets due to the arrests made by CBP Agents. In home classroom lessons are equally being handled for children who are unable to attend school.

New Hackensack Reformed Church Missionaries:

Josh Bode is our Missionary in Oman – In a Muslim Majority nation, God calls Christians to bear witness to peace and reconciliation in Christ. Josh Bode and his wife Erica, serves the Protestant Church of Oman to build bridges and love to their neighbors. They serve Jesus in Oman and bears witness to Christian unity within human diversity while seeking to increase the global church.

At this time, due to the war in Iran, The Bodes have been called back to the USA for their protection. It's not known when or if they will be able to return to Oman to continue their Mission Work.

The Fields are our Missionaries in Columbia – Andrew Fields serves as a professor, coordinator of field education and dean in the Biblical Seminary of Columbia. Amy Fields devotes time to her children and families in the Seminary Community as well as the Seminary Library. They help the Seminary offer high-quality accessible ministry training for the more than 200 students pursuing their calls to proclaim the gospel in Latin America.

NHRC grants each of these Missionaries and annual donation of \$1,500 each.

Prayer Shawls: There are a number of beautiful hand crocheted Prayer Shawls that were made by Amy Burger. With talking to Rev. Jan Fritzing, she is the Chaplain at Vassar Brothers Medical Center, she has asked them to distribute to cancer patients she ministers to.
